RIGGING BAITS

FOR CIRCLE HOOKS

FOR: **SWIM BAIT** SKIP BAIT

1 metre of netting twine Darning needle Bait fish: Gar, Yakka or Mullet Base Circle Hook Rig

Step One

- * Poke eyes out of bait fish and work the bait.
- * If you are using gar, cut the beak off and 'pop' the fish ie. Squeeze it both on sides and top. The fish needs to be floppy.

Step Two

- * Thread the twine through the eye of your needle.
- * Insert the needle through an eye socket and bring it out just behind the pec fin on the opposite side of the fish. Leave about an 8" tag.



- *You now need to make two or three cross stitches depending on the size of your bait. When making the cross stitches enter the fish about a third of the way down below the backbone.
- *The end result of the cross stitches need to hold the fish firm but not restrict it's move-
- *When you've finished the cross stitching insert the needle just behind the pec fin (opposite to the side you've already done) and out through the eye socket (opposite
- *Tie off under the gills with two double granny knots. This needs to be firm.
- *Take one tag end through the eyes, repeat with the other but enter from opposite side.
- *Tie off on top of the head with two double granny knots...This needs to be firm and is the towing point.

*Don't cut the tags off.



Step Three

The mouth needs to be tied up.

- *Cut a piece of twine, about 6" long and thread needle
- *Gar & Mullet: Insert needle into Gill Plate and push through centre of nose. Tie off with a granny knot.

If using Yakkas.

- *Insert needle through gill plate directly in line with a nostril. Push the needle up through
- *Insert needle through other nostril and bring out through gill plate.
- *Tie off with a double granny under the chin.



Step Four

To attach skip Bait Pass the hook under the towing point on the top of the head.

The hook needs to be as close as possible to the head of the fish Centre the hook and tie off with a half hitch using one of the tags.

Repeat this process with the other tag. Finish process with a double granny knot.







SWIM BA

To convert the skip bait to a swim bait.

Thread a no. 4 sinker onto a piece of twine.

Thread one end through eye, repeat with other tag but through opposite eye

Make sure the sinker is centered under the chin

Tie firmly with two double granny knots.

Take the longest tag end and wrap around the sinker as many times as you need to, to make the sinker stiff. Tie off with double Granny



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
